Overview of Volunteer Opportunities at the Huntington Library, Art Collections, and Botanical Gardens

Service Volunteers

Service volunteers work throughout the Huntington in its gardens, nurseries, welcome centers, information areas, offices, and library. Weekly schedules are flexible, and involve a mix of sitting and standing. Many new volunteers begin their involvement as Service Volunteers. Positions are available on an as needed basis.

Required Commitment

- Shifts are 2-3 hours long.
- Volunteers must make a commitment of 8 hours per month for a minimum of a six months.

Information Desk Volunteer

Information Desk Volunteers sit at the Admissions area helping visitors plan their day here by answering questions, and providing maps, calendars, and other resources about what's on at the Huntington. They also provide directions to nearby destinations for out-of-town visitors.

Information Guide

Information Guides are on their feet helping direct visitors around the Huntington grounds. They provide a friendly face, valuable way-finding information, and help visitors get to where they are going.

Mapel Orientation Gallery Volunteer

The Mapel Orientation Gallery features engaging multimedia displays that provide visitors with a welcoming introduction to The Huntington. Volunteers welcome and engage visitors in conversation and provide more background historical information about the Huntington as well as what exhibitions are available.

Art Gallery Welcome Center Volunteer

The Huntington Art Gallery houses a distinguished collection of 18th- and 19th-century British paintings, sculpture, and decorative arts. These volunteers distribute audio guide equipment to visitors, while providing basic tutorials to guests about how to operate the devices. They also answer general questions.

Office Support

A full-time staff of 400+ makes the Huntington run! Office Support volunteers provide a wide range of clerical and administrative work in departments like Human Resources, Advancement, Membership, The President's Office, and other key areas.

Special Projects Volunteers

Short-term initiatives offer volunteers the opportunity to help out in unexpected ways. These volunteers provide support on special projects from time to time as they become available.

Botanical Division – *There are many opportunities for those who like to get their hands in the soil!*

Overview of Volunteer Opportunities at the Huntington Library, Art Collections, and Botanical Gardens

Facilitators and Docents

The Huntington's learning experiences for visitors often take the form of volunteer-led tours and informal conversations. These visitor-centered experiences are lively, interactive, and accessible for all visitors.

Facilitators lead Inquiry-based experiences for K-12 students during school field trips across all three areas of the Huntington: The Art Gallery, The Botanical Gardens, and The Library. Because it is important for students to take an active role in their learning and to make curriculum connections, these volunteers also participate in special trainings on Inquiry-based learning techniques. School Group tours are 1.5 hours long.

Docents lead experiences for general public visitors. They work in the Huntington Art Gallery, the Botanical Gardens, or the Library. Full Garden, Art Gallery, and Library tours are offered to visitors free-with-admission, and welcome all. Estate and Special Group tours are scheduled in advance, and are private. Most tours are 1 – 1.5 hours long.

Weekly schedules for both groups are regular. This work requires extended periods of walking. Training for all teaching volunteers is provided by Huntington Education and Curatorial staff in regular sessions over a fixed period of time. The length of the training course is determined by the scope of the program. Docent and Education Facilitator positions are available on an as needed basis.

Training Requirements for Docents and Education Facilitators

- Attendance at all orientation and training sessions
- 10-20 hours of independent study

Required Commitment

- Facilitators: Full participation in 13-session Master Training Course for each autumn
- Docents: Full participation in training courses for each specific assignment (garden, library, gallery, etc.)
- 8 hours of service per month for the first of 2 years of volunteering

Docents

Art Gallery Docents lead tours of The Huntington's collection of European and/or American Art for visitors from the general public.

Botanical Garden Docents lead tours of specific gardens, as well as Full Garden overview tours for visitors from the general public.

Library Docents lead tours through exhibitions at the Huntington Library for visitors from the general public.

Estate Tour and **Group Tour Docents** lead private tours for groups that focus on connections across the Huntington Library, Art Collections, and Botanical Gardens.

Education Facilitators

School Programs Facilitators lead tours for K-12 students and their teachers in The Art Galleries, The Botanical gardens, and The Library.
